



DIMITRIS BOTIS, Deputy Director for Legal Affairs, International Cooperation & Legal Affairs Department, OHIM, ES

Dimitris studied law in Athens and London (Queen Mary), specialising in IP.

He has worked at OHIM since 1997 as Head of Service in the Trade Marks Department and more recently as Head of the Litigation Service.

Currently, he holds the position of Deputy Director for Legal Affairs in the International Cooperation and Legal Affairs Department. The main responsibilities entrusted to the Legal Affairs area, according to OHIM's Strategic Plan, are to defend Office practice before the EU Courts in Luxembourg, to define the Office's practice in IP matters and update the OHIM's examination manual.

Over the past eight years Dimitris has represented OHIM before the General Court and Court of Justice in cases with a significant impact on EU trade mark law such as; the Lego Brick, the B&Q Loudspeaker and the IP Translator cases. He has also participated in numerous projects and conferences in the field of trade mark law, notably the drafting of the OHIM Guidelines, exchanges with TM Offices, Courts and Academia both within the EU and worldwide.

He is co-author of the book 'Trade Marks in Europe: A Practical Jurisprudence' published by Sweet and Maxwell in December 2009.
